Hello Elbert School Families,

The month of October focuses on Mental Health Awareness. With this in mind, the Counseling and Admin teams would like to provide you with a list of resources to help do the following:

- 1. Raise awareness of the frequency of mental health concerns among young people;
- 2. Know how to recognize signs that a young person may be struggling;
- 3. Be able to respond in an effective, understanding way if something may be wrong.

Colorado ranks above the national average on many measures related to mental illness, and Elbert County falls above the state average on many indicators.

- In Elbert County:
 - 15% of residents (ages 5+) reported eight or more bad mental health days in the past 30 days. Colorado average is 12%
 - 15.7 suicide deaths per 100,000 residents. Colorado average is 19.1
 - 9% of children (under the age of 18) needed mental health care. Colorado average is 15%
 - 18% of high school students reported seriously considering suicide. Colorado average is 17%
